



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





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
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#### Child-Safety Seats

# CHILD-SAFETY SEATS



Child-safety seat To install in rear outboard passenger seat positions using dual-locking mode retractor safety belts; see Owner's Manual for proper installation and seat tether and LATCH system instructions

Climate Controls / WARNINGS: Use age appropriate child restraints, see Owner's Manual and state or province laws Never place rear-facing infant-safety seat in front passenger seat in front of any air bag, an infant is in serious danger of being injured or killed If you must install a forward-facing child-safety seat in the front seating position, move vehicle seat as far back as possible It is strongly recommended that you install front facing child-safety seats in rear seating area

#### Rear child-safety seat anchors


Anchors located on rear seat cushion for securing child-safety seat (see Owner's Manual)

Dual locking mode lap/ shoulder belt retractor

(front passenger and rear outboard belts only) Emergency locking mode: Belt locks only on hard braking/ cornering or impacts of about 5 mph or higher Automatic locking mode must be used when installing child-


safety seat To activate: Pull webbing fully out of retractor until click is heard; belt will only tighten

To disengage: Unbuckle belt and allow webbing to retract



# Transmission

# TRANSMISSION



#### Automatic transmission\* Gearshift must be in Park or

Neutral to start engine; it must be in Park to remove ignition key P = Park

To move gearshift from Park: You must press firmly on the brake pedal and the ignition must be in the ON position

# R = Reverse

Never engage Reverse when vehicle is moving N = Neutral

No gear is engaged; vehicle can roll freely, even on a slight incline, unless the brakes are applied

### (Overdrive)

For normal driving: Transmission shifts through four forward gears Tip: Torque converter lock-up improves fuel economy and can feel like an additional gear


### (Overdrive Off)

Press the overdrive switch (1) to disengage overdrive; an indicator light on the instrument panel will illuminate

#### 2 = Second

Place the gearshift lever in second when accelerating on slippery roads or to provide additional engine braking on downgrades 1 = First

Provides maximum engine braking on steep downgrades



## transmission

Depress clutch pedal completely to start engine and change gears

Stop vehicle completely before shifting into reverse



# **4X4 system\*†** AUTO = Fourwheel drive

Power at normal speed to front axles at all times and to rear axles as required for traction, 4X4 light off LOCK = Full time power to front/rear axles, 4X4 light on To shift from 4X4 AUTO to 4X4 LOCK (any forward speed): Press switch To shift from 4X4 LOCK to 4X4 AUTO high (any forward speed): Press switch

#### Break-in period

First 1,000 miles: Avoid heavy repeated brake use; avoid full throttle, rapid acceleration or kick-down of transmission; drive at varying road and engine speeds Do not tow a trailer for first 500 miles

Do not use special break-in oils -Tip: Follow the same procedures

with newly overhauled engine or when brakes are replaced Anti-lock Braking System

#### (ABS)\* ÀBS automatically reduces

hydraulic pressure to any wheel on the verge of locking up You may feel a slight pulsing of the brake pedal and hear a clicking noise; this tells you the

ABS is functioning properly; increase pressure on pedal for maximum braking

Tips: Maintain constant pressure on the brake pedal Do not pump the brakes

# Tire economy and tips

Check pressure monthly when tires are cold See Owner's Manual for rotation

schedule and chart Tire pressure

Decal on driver's door latch pillar provides tire size and pressure information

### Tire chains\*†

Tire chains can damage aluminum wheels; use on steel wheels only

Tips: Use only SAE class "S" chains, install only on front axles (with P235/70R16 tires) SAE class "S" chains can be installed on both front and rear wheels (with P215/70R16 tires); install as tightly as possible and retighten periodically Never exceed 30 mph with

tire chains

#### Spare tire

Stored under cargo area cover Jack handle Stored underneath cargo cover
