







## ADVANCED KEYLESS ENTRY SYSTEM

- This system allows you to lock and unlock the doors, open the trunk lid of the vehicle and even start the engine without ever taking the key out.
- You can also use the buttons on the advanced key to lock and unlock the doors, open the trunk lid and open the power windows.
- Auxiliary key provided for emergencies.
   See page 2 for details.

### **Advanced Key Features**

- Unlock the doors by simply pushing the driver's door request switch and two beeps will be heard.
- Unlock both doors by pushing again within 3 seconds and two more beeps will be heard OR from the passenger's door request switch by pressing one time OR by pressing the unlock button on the keyless entry transmitter twice.
- Open the trunk by pushing the trunk request switch.
- Lower the front windows by pushing the unlock button on the keyless entry transmitter and then pushing again within 1.5 seconds and holding; release to stop.
- Lock the doors by simply pushing a door request switch. A beep will be heard and the hazard warning lights will flash once.

### STARTING THE ENGINE WITH THE ADVANCED KEY

### While carrying the Advanced Key you can...

- Start the engine by pushing in the start knob. When the key indicator illuminates **GREEN**, turn the start knob while still pushing in. Shut the engine OFF by turning the start knob to the ACC position and then pushing the knob in and turning to the Lock position.
- The key Indicator light will illuminate GREEN when the advanced key is detected. If the key indicator light flashes GREEN, the advanced key transmitter battery power is low. The indicator turns RED when the key is not detected or the transmitter battery is dead. If illuminated RED, use the auxiliary key (see "Emergency Vehicle Entry/Engine Start").



### **NOTE:** Emergency Vehicle Entry/Engine Start

- If the advanced key cannot be used due to a malfunction or dead advanced key battery, use the auxiliary key to lock/unlock the doors and to start the engine.
- To start the engine, remove the start knob cover by pushing both side release buttons while pulling. Insert the auxiliary key into the key cylinder and turn it to start the engine.





This system remotely locks and unlocks the doors, the trunk, and opens the power windows.

- To extend the key, push the release button.
- To retract the key, push the release button and fold the key back into the holder.

## Seats





### **SEAT CONTROLS**

### **Height Adjustment Lever**

Seat can be raised through several heights by continually pulling up on the lever or lowered through several heights by continually pushing down on the lever.

### **Recline Lever**

Seatback angle can be adjusted by pulling up on the lever.



**Behind Seat Storage (Soft top only)** Move seatbacks forward to access the seat back trim storage boxes.

### Slide Release Lever

Seat can be moved forward and rearward by pulling up on the lever.



## **Seat Warmers**

The seats can be warmed by rotating the applicable seat warmer dial while the ignition is ON.



- The seat temperature increases as the number on the dial increases.
- When the seat warmers are not needed, rotate the dials to 0.

### Passenger's Seat Air Bag Deactivation Switch

Deactivate passenger's seat air bag when using a child-safety seat.

To Deactivate/Activate: Insert ignition key or auxiliary key (ADVANCED KEYLESS ENTRY) in switch, rotate to OFF/ON, remove key.

Passenger air bag off indicator illuminates when air bag is deactivated and ignition is on. See Owner's Manual for additional information on this feature.



### **FUEL DOOR RELEASE**

The fuel door release is in the seat side box located between the seats.

- 1 Pull handle to open the seat side box.
- 2 To open the fuel door, pull the fuel door release.



### **FUEL DOOR**

To avoid scratching the paint during refueling, secure the fuel filler cap tether over the hook as shown.



### **FUEL REQUIREMENTS**

91-octane fuel is recommended. If 91-octane fuel is not available, fuel as low as 87-octane can be used temporarily for emergency purposes. Use of fuel lower than 91-octane can decrease performance, cause knocking/engine noise and can deteriorate shift quality. Refueling the vehicle with correct octane fuel a couple of times will restore vehicle performance and shift quality.





- **HI**-Push down to third position for high speed wiper operation.
- Pull toward you to dispense washer fluid and the wipers make several passes across windshield.

### **AUTOMATIC TRANSMISSION**

### Sport AT Manual Shift Mode

The Sport AT Manual Shift Mode gives you the feel of driving a manual transmission by allowing you to manually shift to control engine rpm and torque when more control is desired.



• Shift lever from D to M.

### NOTE:

- Changing to manual mode can be done while driving the vehicle.
- The transmission will not upshift automatically in manual mode, even if the tachometer reaches redline.

### To Shift Up To A Higher Gear:

- Tap shift lever back (+) once.
   OR
- Pull the UP steering shift switch.

### To Shift Down To A Lower Gear:

- Tap shift lever forward (-) once.
   OR
- Push the DOWN steering shift switch.

### **Direct Mode**

To manually shift gears while in Drive, the steering shift switches may be used. After manually shifting, the transmission will return to normal drive mode under any of the following conditions:

- 4 seconds of steady throttle
- Accelerator pedal is fully depressed (Wide Open Throttle)
- Tachometer reaches redline
- Vehicle is stopped or moving at a slow speed

### To Shift Up To A Higher Gear:

 Pull the UP steering shift switch.

### To Shift Down To A Lower Gear:

• Push the DOWN steering shift switch.





### **6-SPEED MANUAL TRANSMISSION**

- Push the clutch pedal down completely to start the engine and to shift gears.
- To place the transmission in Reverse, place shifter in the neutral position, push the shifter down, move to the left and push forward.



Your vehicle is equipped with an AUX or auxiliary jack that will allow you to play your portable audio player through the vehicle's audio system. Refer to the Owner's Manual for additional information.

- **1** Locate the AUX jack below the climate controls.
- 2 Plug your portable audio player into the AUX jack and turn it on.
- 3 Turn the vehicle audio system on.
- 4 Push the AUX button on the audio face or the Mode button on the steering wheel controls.
- 5 Use the portable audio player controls to play music.

**NOTE:** Set the volume level on your portable audio player to the highest level before distortion starts. Then adjust the volume in the vehicle using the audio system power/volume control or the steering wheel volume up and down controls.

### Auto-Dimming Mirror



- Auto-Dimming automatically darkens your rear view mirror to reduce headlight glare from the vehicles behind you.
- Auto-Dimming is activated every time the vehicle is started.

NOTE: In addition to the auto-dimming mirror's rear light sensor, there is also a front light sensor (not shown). Do not place or hang any objects over the front or rear mirror light sensors, otherwise, the auto-dimming mirror will not operate properly.

### HomeLink®



- This feature provides a convenient way to replace up to three transmitters such as garage door openers, home lighting remotes and other radio frequency devices.
- Refer to your Owner's Manual for complete programming details.

### **ALUMINUM WHEEL CARE**

Your aluminum wheels have a protective coating on them. Only use a mild detergent with a sponge or soft cloth to clean them. Using a wire brush, polishing compound, solvent, or any type of abrasive cleaner may damage the protective coating.



### **INSTANT MOBILITY SYSTEM (IMS)**

The IMS emergency flat tire repair kit (located in the trunk of your Mazda) is for a temporary repair of a slightly damaged flat tire, resulting from running over nails, or similar sharp objects on the road surface. Refer to your Owner's Manual for complete details.





















## Convertible Top

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### MANUAL CONVERTIBLE TOP

When raising or lowering the manual convertible top, the vehicle must be stopped on level ground with parking brake set, windows lowered a minimum of 1 inch and all items in the convertible top storage area removed.

### To Lower:

1 Push release button **A** while pulling latch **B** rearward to disengage.



2 Pull front of top rearward to release from windshield header.



• If opening from inside vehicle, use either handle.



 If opening from outside vehicle, grasp side of top, near windshield header. **3** Fold back top and push firmly on front of top to securely lock in open position.



**NOTE:** If manual soft top does not fold easily, then slowly lower it while pushing down on the upper part of rear glass with your hand.



4 Raise wind blocker.



### To Raise:

1 Lower wind blocker.



**2** Pull unlock lever to release top from open position.























### POWER RETRACTABLE HARDTOP

When raising or lowering the power retractable hardtop, the vehicle must be stopped on level ground with parking brake set and ignition on. Shift manual transmission to neutral or shift automatic transmission to Park or Neutral.

### To Lower:

1 Push release button A while pulling latch B rearward to disengage. The indicator light will illuminate when the latch is disengaged indicating the top can be opened.





2 Push and hold the open button. The indicator light will flash during the opening operation.



 Windows automatically lower, deck raises, top lowers, and then deck closes.

**NOTE:** A beep sounds and the indicator light turns off to confirm operation is complete.















## Convertible Top

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3 Raise wind blocker.



### To Raise:

1 Lower wind blocker.



2 Push and hold the close button. The indicator light will flash during the closing operation.



 Windows automatically lower, deck raises, top raises, deck closes.

**NOTE:** A beep sounds and the indicator light turns off to confirm operation is complete.





**3** Push lever on top latch up until lock button clicks and top latch is securely latched.



WARNING: If red indicator is visible on release button, top is not securely latched.



### NOTE:

- If open/close button is released during operation, the operation will stop and a beep will sound.
- If trunk is open, a beep sounds when pushing open/close buttons and top will not operate until trunk is closed.
- If beep sounds when vehicle is placed in gear, verify the power retractable hardtop is fully lowered/raised and the latch is closed if in raised position.
- In case of a power loss, the tools for manually raising the power retractable hardtop are located in the glove compartment; see Owner's Manual for manual operating instructions.





### **Temperature Control Dial**

Automatic climate control will allow you to maintain a preset cabin temperature for the driver and passenger areas individually in the DUAL mode.

### **Fan Control Dial**

- Rotate the dial to set the desired fan speed.
- AUTO: The amount of airflow will be automatically controlled in relation to the set temperature.
- · Rotate dial to OFF to turn system off.
- Push A/C to manually turn air conditioning on or off (indicator lit).

NOTE: Applies to Manual and Automatic Climate Control Systems: With any type of defroster operation, the system turns on the A/C compressor and selects the FRESH AIR mode. This helps defrost the windows more efficiently by dehumidifying the air. The A/C compressor will always be on in defroster mode, but the defroster (and floor) will deliver warm air when the temperature dial is set to a warmer temperature and the engine is at operating temperature.

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## Audio Controls

### **SETTING YOUR CLOCK**

- Push and hold the CLOCK button for 2 seconds until a beep is heard and the displayed time flashes.
- Use H to set hours and M to set minutes, then push the CLOCK button.

NOTE: To select 12-hour or 24-hour clock time, turn the TUNE/AUDIO CONT dial while the clock display is flashing. After selecting the desired display, push the audio control dial to return to the flashing clock display.



## TO LOAD/PLAY A CD (if equipped with 6-CD changer)

- 1. Push the LOAD button.
- **2.** After "IN" is displayed on the Information Display, insert the CD.
- **3.** Repeat steps 1 and 2 until up to 6 CDs are loaded.

### To Change Music CD

Push the DISC button ( $\wedge$  or  $\vee$ ) during playback.

### To Change MP3/WMA CD

Push the DISC button (A or V) for 1.5 seconds or more during playback.

### **AUDIO SYSTEM ON**

• Push the POWER/VOLUME dial to turn the radio on.

### **MEDIA SELECTION**

**Radio:** Push FM/AM button to select the FM1, FM2, or AM band. The selected band will be indicated in the Radio Display.

**NOTE:** If the FM broadcast signal becomes weak, reception automatically changes from STEREO to MONO for reduced noise, and the "ST" indicator will go out.

SIRIUS®: SIRIUS® Satellite radio will deliver the broadest, deepest mix of radio entertainment. See Owner's Manual for more details.

**AUX:** Your vehicle is equipped with an AUX or auxiliary jack that will allow you to play your portable audio player through the vehicle's audio system. See page 12 for details.

### **TUNING**

The radio has the following tuning controls:

- Manual Tuning: Turn the TUNE dial to manually change the frequency.
- Seek Tuning:
   Push the SEEK/TRACK buttons to seek a higher or lower frequency automatically.
- Scan Tuning:
   Push the SCAN button to automatically sample strong station. To hold a station, push the SCAN button again while the desired station is playing.
- Push the Preset Channel buttons (1-6) to select a station stored in memory. To store a station, push and hold a button (1-6) until a beep is heard.

· Preset Channel:

### Auto-Memory Tuning

Push and hold the AUTO-M button to store an additional 6 stations on each FM and AM band without disturbing the previously stored stations. This is useful when driving in an area where the local stations are not known. Refer to the Owner's Manual for complete details.

## FOLDER SEARCH (during MP3/WMA CD playback)

 To change to the previous folder, push the folder down button (V) for less than 1.5 seconds, or push the folder up button (∧) for less than 1.5 seconds to advance to the next folder.

- 8 Use your phone's manual for instructions on how to proceed.

- 9 Input the 4-digit code.
- 10 Name your phone, like, "Heather's Phone".
- 11 The prompt will confirm the name. After the beep say, "Yes" or "No".
- **12** After the beep say a priority number between 1 and 7. 1 being the phone used most often.
- 13 The prompt will confirm the priority number. After the beep say, "Yes" or "No".
- 14 Pairing is complete.

### To Make or Receive a Hands-Free Call:

- 1 To make a call, push ( ).
- 2 After the beep say, "Dial".
- 3 Say the number you want dialed. If the number repeated back is correct say, "Yes," and the prompt will say it is dialing.
- To receive a call, push (\(\xi\)/\(\xi\).
- To end or reject a call, push and hold (ξ/κ); a beep will confirm the call is ended.

### NOTE:

- When using voice recognition, wait until the beep. Prompt can be interrupted by pushing ⟨⟨⟨, button.
