Advanced Key







ADVANCED KEYLESS ENTRY SYSTEM

 This system allows you to lock and unlock the doors, open the liftgate and even start the engine without taking the key out.

While Carrying the Advanced Key...

- **Unlock the driver's door** by pushing the driver's door request switch once.
- Unlock all doors and the liftgate by pushing the driver's door request switch twice or by pushing the passenger's door request switch or the liftgate request switch.
- Lock all doors and the liftgate by pushing the driver's door or passenger door request switch or liftgate request switch once.
- Open the front windows and moon roof by pushing the unlock button on the advanced key and then pushing again and holding; release to stop.
- Close front windows and moon roof by pushing and holding the driver's door request switch; release to stop.

KEYLESS ENTRY SYSTEM

This system remotely locks and unlocks the doors and the liftgate, and opens the power windows and moon roof.

Retractable Key

Release Button

- Push to extend key.
- Push & fold to retract key.

Unlock

- Push once to unlock driver's doors.
- Push twice (within three seconds) to unlock all doors and liftgate.
- Push twice and hold to open front windows and moon roof.

Lock

- Push once to lock all doors and liftgate.
- Push twice (within five seconds) for horn sound verification that all doors are locked.

Panic Alarm

- Push for one second or more to activate alarm.
- Push Lock, Unlock, or Panic Alarm to turn alarm off.

STARTING THE ENGINE

While Carrying the Advanced Key...

- Start the engine by pushing the start knob in and turning it (like a normal key) while depressing the brake pedal.
- Shut the engine OFF by turning the start knob to the ACC position and then pushing in and turning to the Lock position.
- The KEY indicator light will show green when the advanced key is detected. If the KEY indicator light flashes green, the advanced key transmitter battery power is low.

With the Auxiliary Key...

- 1 To start engine, remove the Start knob cover by squeezing both release buttons and pulling the cover off.
- 2 Push the key release to remove the auxiliary key.
- 3 Insert the auxiliary key into the key cylinder and turn it to start the engine.

Release Buttons

LIFTGATE

- To open, unlock the liftgate, pull up on the handle and raise the liftgate.
- To close, push liftgate down until it securely locks, but do not slam.



Power Liftgate Switch

POWER LIFTGATE

- To open or close using the advanced keyless transmitter, unlock the liftgate and push and hold the open/close button for one second or more.
- To open or close from the driver's seat, unlock the liftgate and push and hold the power liftgate switch on the dashboard (see Driver's View) for one second or more.
- To close when the liftgate is open, push and hold the power liftgate switch located on the lower edge of the liftgate panel for one second or more.

Seats



ELECTRONICALLY OPERATED SEAT W/MEMORY

Recline Switch

Push forward or backward to adjust seatback angle.

Slide/Tilt Switch

Seat can be moved back and forth, raised, lowered, or tilted with this control.



Memory Seat Switch

Lumbar Switch

Push forward or backward to increase or decrease lumbar support.

To Program the Driver's Seat Position

- 1 Park the vehicle.
- 2 Adjust the seat to the desired position using the slide/tilt and recline switches.
- **3** Push the memory seat SET button followed by one of the programming buttons (1-3) until a beep is heard. Programming is now complete. Program the remaining two buttons as desired.

NOTE: You can also program a seat position for each advanced key/retractable type key used with the vehicle. See Owner's Manual for programming instructions.

To Move the Seat to a Programmed Position

- 1 Shift the selector lever to the P position.
- **2** Push the programming button (1-3) that you selected when programming your seat position.

SPLIT FOLDING THIRD-ROW SEAT

To create a flat luggage compartment space, fold the seatbacks forward.

- 1 Open liftgate.
- 2 Lower head restraints.
- 3 Pull each strap on the rear of the seat while pushing the left and right seat forward to lay flat.




To Return to the Original Position

Pull the strap to return the seatback to the original position.

THIRD-ROW SEAT ACCESS

- Pull the third-row seat access lever on the side of the second-row seatback to fold and slide the seat forward to access third-row seating.
- Return the second-row seatback to the normal upright position by pulling up on the seatback until it locks into place.
- Slide the second-row seat forward or back for proper legroom using the lever under the front of the seat.



SECOND ROW SEATBACK RECLINE

To recline the seatback, lean forward slightly while folding lever. Then lean back to the desired position and release the lever.

FOLDING THE SECOND-ROW SEATS

- 1 Unfasten the lap portion of the center-rear seat belt.
- 2 Slide seat all the way back toward rear of vehicle.
- 3 Lower head restraints.
- 4 Pull the seatback folding lever and fold the seatback forward.

LIGHTING CONTROL/TURN SIGNAL LEVER

AUTO: The light sensor automatically determines when to turn the headlights on or off.

HEADLIGHT LEVELING

Adjust headlight angle with headlight leveling switch depending on vehicle passengers & load (example: Driver only = 0, Driver + Passengers = 1 or 2, etc.). Refer to your Owner's Manual for complete details.

WINDSHIELD/REAR WINDOW WIPER/WASHER CONTROL LEVER

AUTO: The rain sensor senses the amount of rainfall and turns the wipers on or off. Rotate inner ring away from you (clockwise) for less sensitivity (requires more rain to turn wipers on) and towards you (counterclockwise) for more sensitivity (requires less rain to turn wipers on).

NOTE: Vehicles not equipped with AUTO wipers will have INT wipers. Set the lever to INT and choose an interval timing by rotating the ring between fast and slow.



CAUTION: When the ignition is ON turn the AUTO wipers OFF when going through a car wash, or while cleaning or touching the windshield.







Feature Highlights

SPORT A/T MANUAL SHIFT MODE

The Sport A/T Manual Shift Mode gives you the feel of driving a manual transmission by allowing you to manually shift to control engine rpm and torque when more control is desired.

To Use Manual Shift Mode:

Shift lever from D to M.

NOTE: Changing to manual mode can be done while driving the vehicle.

To Shift Up to a Higher Gear:

• Tap shift lever back (+) once.





The transmission will automatically adjust how and when it shifts gears based on road conditions and your driving style. The transmission may stay in a lower gear longer than usual when going up or down hills or driving around corners. This feature gives you better control and a more connected driving experience.

AUTO-DIMMING MIRROR AND HOMELINK®



Auto-Dimming Mirror

- Auto-dimming will automatically darken your rearview mirror to reduce headlight glare from vehicles behind you.
- Auto-dimming is activated every time the vehicle is started.

NOTE: In addition to the auto-dimming mirror's rear light sensor, there is also a front light sensor (not shown). Do not place or hang any objects over the front or rear mirror light sensors; otherwise, the auto-dimming mirrors will not operate properly.

HomeLink® P P

- This feature provides a convenient way to replace up to three transmitters such as garage door openers, home lighting remotes and other radio frequency devices.

ALUMINUM WHEEL CARE

Your aluminum wheels have a protective coating on them. Only use a mild soap or neutral detergent with a sponge or soft cloth to clean them. Using a wire brush, polishing compound, solvent, or any type of abrasive cleaner may damage the protective coating.

















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BLIND SPOT MONITORING (BSM) SYSTEM


The Blind Spot Monitoring (BSM) system is designed to assist the driver by monitoring the blind spots to the rear of the vehicle on both sides.

- If your vehicle speed is 20 mph (32 km/h) or more, the BSM will warn you of vehicles in the detection area by illuminating the BSM warning lights located on the left and right door mirrors.
- If you operate a turn signal in the direction of an illuminated BSM warning light, the system will also warn you with a beeping sound and warning light flash.
- BSM sensors are located under the left and right rear bumper areas. The BSM system may not operate properly if the rear bumper gets too dirty, so keep the rear bumper area clean.

Please refer to your Owner's Manual for complete details.

Turning BSM System Off

To manually turn the BSM system off, push the BSM OFF switch on the dash. The BSM OFF indicator will illuminate in the instrument cluster when the BSM system is off. The BSM system will automatically turn on the next time the vehicle is started.





NOTE: Do not rely completely on the BSM system and be sure to look over your shoulder before changing lanes:

- The BSM system can assist the driver in confirming the safety of the surroundings, but is not a complete substitute.
- The driver is responsible for ensuring safe lane changes and other maneuvers.
- Always pay attention to the direction in which the vehicle is traveling and the vehicle's surroundings.
- The BSM system does not operate when the vehicle speed is lower than about 20 mph (32 km/h).

PORTABLE AUDIO PLAYER INTEGRATION USING THE AUX JACK

Your vehicle is equipped with an AUX or auxiliary jack that will allow you to play your portable audio player through the vehicle's audio system. Learn the system when parked and do not let it distract you while driving. Refer to the Owner's Manual for additional information.





- 1 Locate the AUX jack inside the center console.
- 2 Plug 1/8 inch mini stereo plug into the portable audio player and into the AUX jack. Turn portable audio player on.
- 3 Turn the vehicle audio system on.
- 4 Without Navigation System: Push AUX button on audio system OR push MODE button on steering wheel controls until "AUX" is displayed.
 - With Navigation System: Push SOURCE button on audio system, then push AUX1 on screen OR push MODE button on steering wheel controls until "AUX1" is displayed.
- **5** Use the portable audio player controls to play music.

IMPORTANT: Set the volume level on your portable audio player to the highest level before distortion starts, then adjust the volume on the audio system.

FRONT SEAT WARMERS

The driver and front passenger seats can be warmed by pushing the applicable seat warmer button while the ignition is ON.

- Seat temperature increases as the number of indicator lights increases. Two lights equal high, one light equals low.
- When the seat warmers are not needed, push button until indicator lights are off.

Driver Temperature Control Dial

AUTO ON: Push dial to turn Automatic Air Conditioning system on. Rotate dial to select your desired set temperature (shown in information Display above). The airflow and amount of airflow will be automatically controlled in accordance with the set temperature.



Push to turn DUAL mode ON/OFF.

- With DUAL mode ON (indicator on), rotate the dial to set passenger side (shown in the Information Display above).
- With DUAL mode OFF (indicator off), driver controls the temperature setting on both sides.

Automatic climate control will allow you to maintain individual preset cabin temperatures for the driver and passenger when DUAL mode is selected.

NOTE: Automatic Temperature control always works even if Auto indicator comes off by rotating fan speed or changing vent mode.

Push to manually turn air conditioning ON or OFF.

MODE Push to select the desired airflow mode.

OUTSIDE Push to display outside temperature. Push and hold for three seconds or longer to switch from Fahrenheit and Celsius or vice versa.

Push to turn climate control system off.

FRONT Push to defrost the windshield.

TILL REAR Push to defrost the rear window.

REAR Push to allow control from the rear controls (indicator on).

Rotate dial to turn the system ON and to select the desired fan speed.

Push to recirculate cabin air to reduce outside odors and improve cooling (indicator on) or receive fresh air (indicator off).

Rear Climate Control Operation from Front Seats

- 1 Turn the front air conditioning on.
- 2 Push the REAR control button on the front control panel (indicator on).
- 3 Selection of the airflow mode, airflow amount and temperature will be automatically controlled to the same setting as the front air conditioner.



NOTE: If the rear AUTO button is pushed while the front A/C button is off, the rear air conditioning operates only to circulate air. Setting the temperature to the maximum high or low will not provide the desired temperature at a faster rate.



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Audio Controls Without Navigation

- Push and hold the CLOCK button until displayed time flashes.
- 2. Push and hold the H (hours) button to the correct hour.
- **3.** Push and hold the **M** (minutes) button to the correct minute.





TO LOAD/PLAY A CD

(if equipped with 6-CD changer)

- 1. Push the LOAD button.
- 2. After "IN" is displayed on the Information Display, insert the CD.
- **3.** Repeat steps 1 and 2 until up to 6 CDs are loaded.

To Change Music CD

Push the DISC button (\land or \lor) during playback.

Push the DISC button (Λ or \vee) for 1.5 seconds or more during playback.

SETTING YOUR CLOCK

Select and hold the AUTO-M on-screen button until beep is heard to store an additional 8 stations on each FM and AM band without disturbing the previously stored stations. Refer to the Owner's Manual for complete details.



INSERTING THE MAP DISC





Your navigation system operates using the map discs supplied.

- Disc A covers most of the Midwest and Western states including Hawaii and Alaska.
- Disc B covers some of the Midwest and all of the Eastern states including Puerto Rico.
- Both discs cover all of Canada.

NOTE: If the "state your address is in" is not displayed when entering a destination, you may have the wrong disc in the navigation system.

- 1 Push LOAD
- 2 When "Load/Eject" screen appears select "MAP". Wait for navigation screen to tilt open.
- 3 Remove current map disc (if installed) and insert the desired map disc, with the printed side facing up, into the lower DVD MAP slot.
- **4** Read the Caution carefully and select the "AGREE" on-screen button.

You can choose setting a destination using a street address, point of interest, emergency, memory point, home, preset destination, previous destination, freeway on/off ramp, coordinates, or select from map.

- 1 Push "MENU" button on navigation face.
- 2 Select "Destination Entry".
- 3 Select "Address".
- 4 Select the "State" or "Province".
 - Scroll down past the States to find Canadian Provinces.
- 5 Select "City".
- 6 Select "Input City Name".
- 7 Use the keyboard to enter the city name.
- 8 Select "Street".
- 9 Use the keyboard to enter the street name.
- 10 Select "House No".
- 11 Use the keyboard to enter the house number, then select "OK".
- 12 When the map appears, select "Destination".
- 13 Select "Start" or just start driving.

NOTE:

- For safety reasons, some navigation functions cannot be performed via the Navigation screen while driving.
- When entering numbers for a street name, (e.g., 1st Ave.), push "Sym." button to switch to the numeric keyboard.
- Map Orientation: "North Up" Geographic north is up.
 "Head Up" The direction you are heading is up.
- Route Preferences: Select "Prefer" or "Avoid" for toll roads, major roads, ferries, restricted roads and border crossing.
- **RETURN** button: Push button to return to the previous navigation screen.
- VOICE button: Push to replay a voice navigation assist from the navigation system.
- DISP button: Push to set screen angle, brightness, contrast, day/night screen and display on/off.
